



Puget Sound Antique Tractor and Machinery Association Safety Regulations.

Safety is the primary goal for the Puget Sound Antique Tractor and Machinery Association. It is everyone's responsibility to demonstrate safety and to adhere to PSATMA Safety Regulations when operating equipment.

For all pulling rules see pulling registration. For working and running gas engine displays, see information booth for rules and regulations.

All tractors and displays will be set up in the designated areas approved by the Show Director or the PSATMA board.

All vehicles on show grounds must have a valid vehicle pass displayed from mirror. No vehicles will be allowed on to the show grounds after 10:00 a.m., unless approved by the Show Director and the President.

All motorized vehicles, tractors and lawn tractors moving on the show grounds must be limited to no more than a brisk walking pace/5 mph. All traffic will drive counter clockwise on designated Showground roads only, unless otherwise noted by signage.

Driving on show grounds of any kind is prohibited for one hour after the end of the show parade.

Only ONE person is allowed on any tractor while moving unless proper secondary seating provisions have been made and have been approved by the Show Director or the Board or if the tractor requires more than one person to operate it.

Drivers on show grounds must have a valid driver's license or a PSATMA Youth Driver's Safety Program License. For information on how to obtain a Youth License, contact Bryan Cobb (360.389.8993) or visit the Information Booth.

Club machinery or rented equipment is to be operated by Board authorized personnel only. These persons must be qualified and of age to operate the equipment they intend to use. Proper clothing must be worn, no open toe shoes.

If an accident is to occur, activity will be stopped immediately. The Safety Director, Show Director and/or President will review the incident using the PSATMA accident review plan. A copy of this plan is available at the information booth.

No dogs or bicycles on the show grounds during show hours (registered service dogs are welcome).

No tractors/lawnmowers/equipment is allowed in designated camping areas.

Alcohol is not permitted on show grounds.
